## THE CAUSE



EVERY DAY 5.5 MILLION APPALACHIAN CHILDREN ARE FACED WITH THE OVERWHELMING TASK OF HAVING TO PAVE THEIR PATHS TO SUCCESS. THE APPALACHIAN REGION SPANS 13 STATES AND 420 COUNTIES; ALL OF WHICH ARE PLAGUED BY HIGH POVERTY RATES AND LOWER COLLEGE ATTENDANCE RATES. THE IBELIEVE FOUNDATION AIMS TO CLOSE THESE GAPS BY PROVIDING STUDENTS WITH THE REAL WORLD SKILLS NECESSARY TO PROPEL THEM ON TO COLLEGE, WHILE ALSO PREPARING THEM FOR LIFE BEYOND THE CLASSROOM.

97% OF AMERICANS BELIEVE OUR STUDENTS NEED "REAL WORLD" SKILLS TO BE SUCCESSFUL BEYOND HIGH SCHOOL, ACCORDING TO THE LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE EDUCATION FUND, NATIONAL SURVEY ON COMMON CORE (2015). YET, APPALACHIAN STUDENTS ATTEND COLLEGE AT RATES AS LOW AS 35% - FAR BELOW THE NATIONAL AVERAGE OF 63%, ACCORDING TO THE APPALACHIAN REGIONAL COMMISSION.

#### SUMMER WORKSHOP

SUMMER WORKSHOP IS OUR SIGNATURE PROGRAM DESIGNED FOR STUDENTS TO DEVELOP REAL-WORLD LEADERSHIP SKILLS NECESSARY TO PREPARE THEM FOR THE CLASSROOMS AND JOBS OF TOMORROW, STUDENTS SPEND 5 DAYS AND 4 NIGHTS ON A COLLEGE CAMPUS OF THEIR CHOICE, OVER THE COURSE OF THE WEEK, STUDENTS WILL LEARN MORE ABOUT THEMSELVES AND THE SKILLS THEY NEED TO GROW AS A SUCCESSFUL LEADER IN THEIR FUTURES. THE PROGRAM ALLOWS STUDENTS TO FORM LIFE-LONG FRIENDSHIPS WITH ONE ANOTHER, AS WELL AS NETWORK WITH THE STAFF AND OTHER ADULTS.

#### YOUTH LEADERSHIP SUMMITS

SUMMITS ARE SCHOOL-DAY EVENTS THAT ARE HOSTED AT A COLLEGE CAMPUS, PARTICIPATING HIGH SCHOOLS SELECT STUDENTS FOR A DAY CENTERED AROUND THE BASIC SKILLS OF LEADERSHIP, SUMMITS ARE HOSTED REGIONALLY IN AN EFFORT TO RE-CONNECT WITH STUDENTS THAT HAVE PREVIOUSLY PARTICIPATED IN AN IBELIEVE PROGRAM AND TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL PROGRAM OPPORTUNITIES FOR NEW STUDENTS.

## NATIONAL APPALACHIAN STUDENT LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

NASLC IS A UNIQUE, EXPENSE-FREE OPPORTUNITY FOR STUDENTS TO CONVENE IN A COLEGE SETTING TO DISCUSS, ANALYZE, AND ADDRESS REAL-WORLD ISSUES AFFECTING THEIR HOMETOWNS. STUDENTS ENGAGE WITH NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED GUEST SPEAKERS, LOCAL AND STATE POLITICAL REPRESENTATIVES, AND EDUCATIONAL PROFESSIONALS TO BEGIN A DIALOGUE SURROUNDING THE CHALLENGES RURAL COMMUNITIES ENCOUNTER IN THE 21ST CENTURY.

STATEHOUSE DAY PROVIDES STUDENTS WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO INTERACT WITH STATE POLITICIANS AND ENGAGE IN MEANINGFUL DIALOGUE ABOUT ISSUES AND CHALLENGES AFFECTING APPALACHIAN COMMUNITIES. STUDENTS WILL ALSO HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO COLLABORATE WITH STATE LEGISLATORS TO DISCUSS KEY LEADERSHIP COMPONENTS OF THE 21<sup>ST</sup> CENTURY.


